From Grove to Grove. . .

On October 9 Mayor Jay Gohman declared the Terrace Park Nature Preserve would now be known as the Miami Grove Nature Preserve, by a resolution of Council. He unveiled an artist's rendering of a plaque which will outline the layout of the former community. Several members of the Miami Grove families joined current Terrace Parkers for the celebration.

As a result of TPHS's program last spring, which featured some past residents telling of their lives in the old Miami Grove, the Society suggested that the village council rename the area to recall its past.

This small cluster of vintage summer camps along the river, known as Miami Grove, became low-cost rental property. They were abandoned in 1959 after a particularly bad flood, and the houses were later demolished.

The village purchased the 62 acres in 1957, and got control in 1966. In 1971 a citizen group planned and implemented an area for passive recreation on the land.
