"I grew up in the Price Hill/Western Hills area of Cincinnati, Ohio. As a kid back in the 1960's and 1970's, it was fairly common for me to jump on my 10 speed bicycle and take a day trip around the area. The trips started out visiting other neighborhoods in Cincin-

nati and gradually I expanded my trips further into northern Kentucky, Versailles, Indiana and Oxford, Ohio.

"At the time, I really didn't realize the significance of the buildings surrounding me on these rides. It wasn't until later in life that I became obsessed with discovering these hidden treasures. I was literally amazed with what I could find within 10 miles of my home

"With just a little research I discovered one-room school houses, former mills, old blacksmith shops, Sears and Roebuck homes, Ghost Roads and Phantom Bridges, former gen-

eral stores and taverns, Civil War sites, historic churches, and more!

New Village Directory


