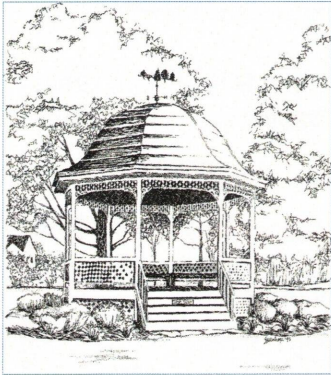

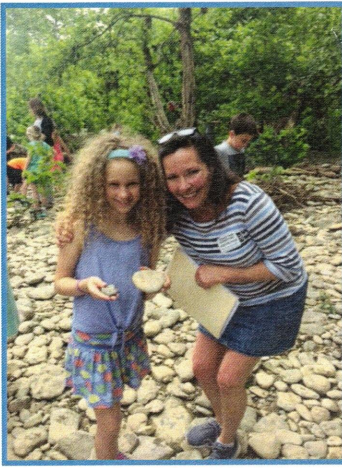


Catching frogs

Annual Third Grade Walk

On a sunny spring morning of May 30th, the third grade classes of Julie Parker and Jennifer Niezgoda took a walk to Miami Grove. Steve Early, VV editor and historian, and I were their guides. The first stop was the large stone honoring John Smith, our first settler, which is located by the Lindells at the corner of Elm and Ford Roads. Buried underneath is a time capsule that was dedicated in 1976. Inside are letters to children and future grandchildren, a village phone book, an elephant trophy, quilt pattern and other items. It will be opened in 2026. We continued on to the "map" of the Grove. The kids even knew what the 'key' was, they are so smart. Steve entertained and educated them with stories of the first settlers, Indians, and how Round Bottom got its name. In the 1920's families from the city would vacation here in summer

cottages. After the depression they were abandoned. They eventually became low rent housing until the 1959 flood. The cottages were eventually condemned. We walked by the remaining chimney from the Arcadie Club, found an old well pipe and where Earls Cafe use to be. We continued on to the Little Miami access. The kids looked for arrow heads and fossils. They really enjoyed catching baby frogs too. It was a great time. Everyone should take a walk through the Miami Grove Nature Preserve. 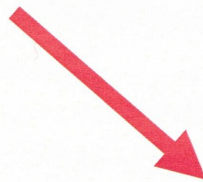
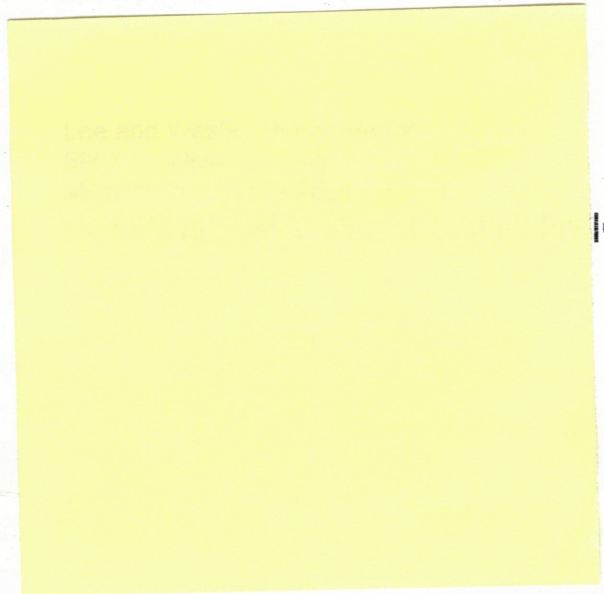
