Mariemont School Board approves new facilities plan

At their October 20th meeting, the Mariemont City Schools Board of Education voted unanimously in favor of adopting the comprehensive district facilities plan recommended by School Superintendent Paul Imhoff at the previous month's meeting. The plan includes economizing from five school buildings to four and relocating the junior high. The eight-point plan promotes the following facilities changes and next steps for implementation and financing decisions:

The district has been working with school facilities professionals SFA Architects and Turner Construction throughout the planning process.

"I am pleased with the very thorough and engaging process we have used to get to this point. I have confidence that our decision phase will help give us even more definition to our plan," said Board of Education president, Marie Huenefeld. "It is the right thing to do."

Mariemont Schools Super-

School Building Configuration & Construction:

- Construct a new 7-8 junior high school on the current Fairfax Elementary site and integrate the current cupola into the new structure.
- Utilize the composite approach (combination of new construction and building renovation) for Mariemont Elementary School (K-6) and, at a minimum, save the front facade of the current school and the auditorium. Students who currently attend Fairfax Elementary would attend Mariemont Elementary.
- Utilize the composite approach for Terrace Park Elementary (K-6) and, at a minimum, save the front facade of the original portion of the building.
- Utilize the Dale Park (current junior high) building as "swing space" to house junior high and Mariemont Elementary School students during the construction/renovation of those buildings, thus saving the district money on modular classroom rental fees.
- Relocate the Board of Education office to Mariemont Elementary School.
- Explore "green" technologies and design buildings that are energy efficient.

Next Steps in Planning Process:

- Engage the community and research possible options for the Dale Park Building after the completion of all projects.
- Appoint a Financial Advisory Board comprised of district residents from each community to study financing and implementation options for the needed facilities. The committee would be asked to submit a report to the Treasurer and Superintendent regarding the draft district plans prior to the December Board of Education meeting.

The Board-approved plan is the product of a 14-plus month process where the district engaged feedback from community, parents, staff, students and school facilities professionals. The plan will provide a framework to guide long-term decisions as the district deals with aging buildings with failing infrastructure and

intendent Paul Imhoff added, "Blending our financial needs with our building needs is our next major and important step. I'm confident that together with the expertise of our Financial Advisory Board, we'll develop a complete plan that works best for our community."

R. Walters remembered for art, helping others

Richard Walters of Boone, NC passed away on Sunday, September 27, 2009 in the Watauga Medical Center due to diabetes related complications. Richard was the son of John and Mary Anne Walters who lived on Douglas Avenue in Terrace Park from 1965 through 1981. Richard lived with his parents while attending Mariemont High School until his graduation in 1967. Following his graduation, he was a part-time Terrace Park resident while he attended Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio and The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.

He was born in 1949 in Lima, Ohio. He advanced through the Lima City School system through 9th grade when the family moved to the Cincinnati area, living first in Mariemont for a brief time and then relocating to Terrace Park.

Prior to moving to Boone in 1982, he lived and worked for several years each in Newberryport, MA, Jonesboro, TN and Asheville, NC. In Boone he pursued his love

for sculpture, collaborating with other artists to create many pieces of art in the Boone area. When failing health forced him to give up sculpting, he turned to painting as his favored form of creative expression. He will be remembered most for his work helping those suffering from alcoholism to find sobriety, and to live happy and fulfilling lives. He will be missed.

He is survived by a son, Jesse Walters of Boone; a brother, David Walters, and wife Lonnie of Hendersonville, NC; a nephew, John Walters of Hendersonville, NC; and a maternal aunt, Nancy Dawe of Lima, Ohio.

The funds for TPRC raised from sports, Labor Day weekend and Monte Carlo night have been put to great use this year. A survey done earlier this year among parents with kids in Rec sports indicated desired improvements. Some of the projects completed :

- **Widening of the back road**

If you've recently been down to Drackett Field to watch a soccer game or pick up a child from practice you should have noticed that parking and driving on the back road is no longer akin to doing an obstacle course in a dust bowl. The back road improvement project included removing the wooden posts, adding a total of 9ft of road to widen the existing road (some of which had been limestone gravel), and then tarring and chipping the surface. Under the leadership of Tiger Nelson and with the help of Sy Swart and the rest of the TPRC, bids were collected and evaluated and the final bid for the road improvement awarded to TowneScapes. Thanks also to

Reed Peterson and Alex Mitchell for their work on removing the stumps close to the road.

- **Drinking fountain upgrades**

Replaced the existing fountain by the back shed with a new handicap-accessible model and also tapped into the existing lines for a new pump valve. Thanks to Nelson Stark for their support on the project and Steve Vianello at Lawnscape for the pavers around the fountain.

- **Bathroom enclosures**

Spearheaded by Bren Fries, the facilities at Drackett were enclosed to be more "user-friendly" and aesthetically pleasing for players and families alike. A second, larger unit was placed in a convenient location to soccer and lacrosse events.

One other big accomplishment for the year was getting background checks on coaches. With the help of Chief Jerry Hayhow we are able to do this now in a discreet and professional manner. We want to thank

Tricia DiMichele for seeing this important task through. Also for her completed term as president, previous committee position and ongoing support of TPRC. She has been a true asset to the committee.

A couple of items to look forward to in 2009/2010 are new basketball uniforms, reinstatement of the 3-on-3, tournament (November 22nd) and our annual Monte Carlo night (January 29th, 2010). Thanks for your continued support.



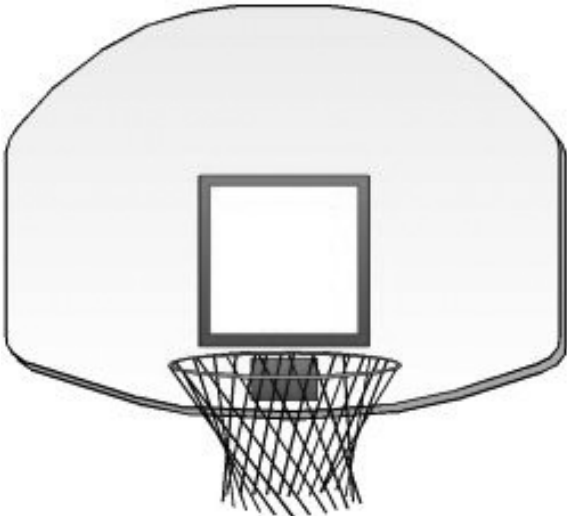
