## Council Receives Money for Village Clock

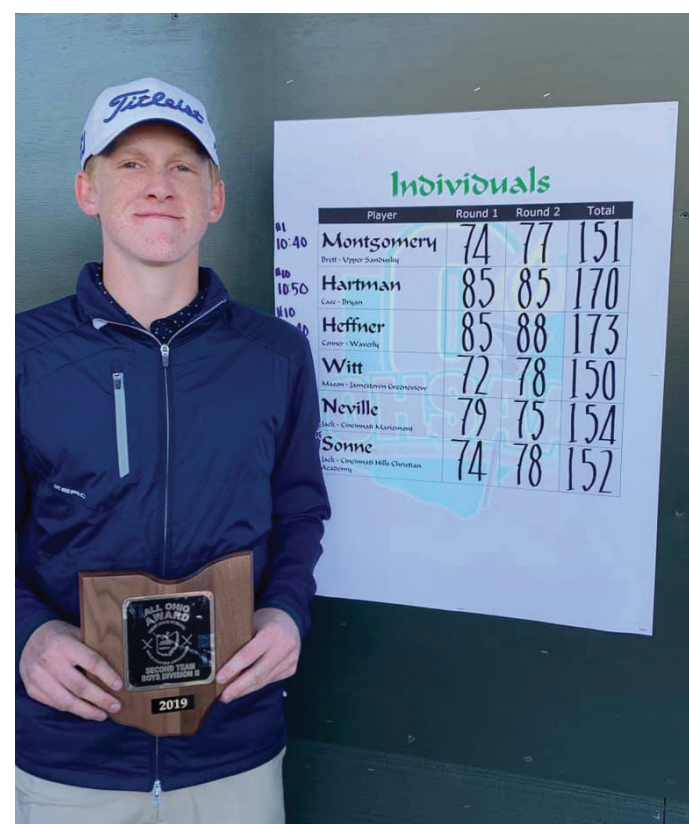

The September meeting of the Council for the Village of Terrace Park was called to order by Mayor Tepe. The Mayor recognized Mr. Jay Gohman who was representing Mrs. Nancy Everhart-Safran, a former Village resident, who has raised and donated funds of \$13,500 toward the purchase of a clock for the Village. The location of the clock will be determined by the Buildings and Grounds Committee. Residents will be notified when the dedication ceremony will take place. Mayor Tepe thanked

Mrs. Everhart-Safran for the donation.

Mayor: The mayor announced the appointment of Mr. Steve Holmes for another one-year term on the Village Planning/Zoning Committee. He then thanked everyone who helped make the Labor Day Celebration a success once again noting how these events make the Village an amazing place to reside. Mayor Tepe then reminded residents to submit to the Village any plans for property alterations

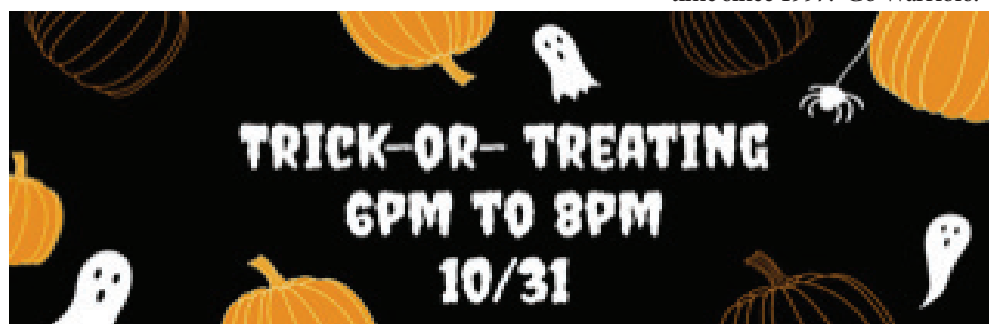
## Division II State Finalist

Neville finished second (38-36=74) amongst 72 individual golfers in the OHSAA Southwest Division II Boys District Tournament at Beaver Creek Golf Club.

Jack then moved on to the Division II Boys' State Championship golf tournament held at the North-

Star Golf Course in Sunbury. The 36 hole tourney was held on Friday, October 11 & Saturday, October 12. He ended up finishing 6th in the state out of 72 individual golfers with a score of 154. He was only four strokes behind the state medalist.

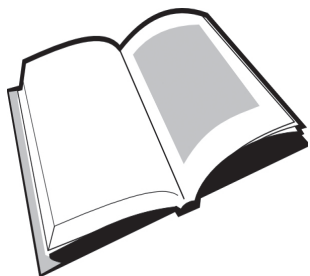

since projects are always easier if permits are requested in advance.  
EMS: Mr. Maggard noted the use of a helicopter over Stanton field was part of a Hamilton County causality-training event. A new EMS class will begin in January. Any one interested should contact Mr. Maggard or the Village office.  
  
Police/Village Administrator: Mr. Hayhow stated that the Village web site now has an easier format for submitting approval for property improvements/alterations. He also noted that the Duke Energy underground utilities project is on hold until funding is restored.

Buildings/Grounds: A resolution was presented for the third reading declaring the necessity of and providing for controlling the blight and disease of shade trees within public rights-of-way and for planting, maintaining, trimming, and removing shade trees in and along the streets which includes all

area within Village boundaries for the year 2020, and authorizing the Village to do such for the year 2020, providing for the levying of an assessment upon real property in Terrace Park for the cost and expense of such work. The ordinance was passed.  
  
Finance: Mr. LeMay presented a resolution to empower the chief fiscal officer to revise the 2019 appropriation budget to provide \$6,500 to install the new Village clock. As noted, the funds to purchase the clock have been donated. The resolution passed.

Public Safety: Mr. Gaskey thanked the Village Administrator for the improved crosswalks at the corners of Elm, Park, and Dennison Streets.  
  
With no further committee reports or business, the meeting was adjourned.

# Garden Club Offers Autumn Advice

The Terrace Park Garden Club (TPGC)’s November 5st meeting will include a presentation by Melinda O’Briant from Turner Farm. Melinda will discuss organic methods to care for your garden and plants without pesticides and chemicals. This meeting will be held at St. Thomas Episcopal Church in the Hearth Room (enter at the side entrance, down the hall to the right). The meeting starts at 12:00 with refreshments, followed by club business, then the presentation from 1:00 -2:00. This meeting is open to the public. Please join us!  
Tips from Chris McKeown from Denny McKeown’s Bloomin’ Garden Centre and Landscape, our speaker from October:  
#1 Tip – Water Your Plants, Shrubs and Trees!

Fall is supposed to be the plants’ recovery period before Winter, but since we’ve had high temperatures and a drought it’s key to hydrate them now. Put a sprinkler on your plants and shrubs for about two hours. Make sure the plant base gets soaked and then spread water out to cover the roots. Trees need about 3-4 hours of watering. It’s better to water your plants, shrubs and trees for 1-2 hours two times per week then 15 minutes per day. You want to make sure the water soaks down into the soil about 6-8 inches.

Don’t fertilize them unless they are well watered.  
#2 Tip – Stop Pruning for the Season  
Pruning stimulates new growth, and it’s time for plants to start to slow down.  
#3 Tip – Fall is the Best Time to Feed Your Lawn  
Did you know that Fall, not Spring is actually the best time to fertilize your lawn? Give your grass a nitrogen fertilizer treatment in mid-September and November to

ensure it stores nutrients through winter. Fertilome® is a great product. In late March, utilize a pre-emergent weed controller, such as Prodiamine® to prevent crabgrass.

# Mariemont Scouts Christmas Tree Sales Return for 27th Year

The Scouts of Mariemont Troop 149 will return for their 27th consecutive year of Christmas tree sales on Black Friday, November 29. Located on the lawn of the Mariemont Municipal Building at 6907 Wooster Pike, the Scouts' Christmas tree lot is an annual tradition for many in the area. We now offer extended Black Friday hours: noon to 8 pm, so you can kick the season off right!

Immediately after being cut down, Fraser firs and white pines ranging from five feet to 12 feet tall are brought by truck from a family-owned farm. The troop receives several shipments during the season so you know you're getting a fresh tree. Thick, fresh pine roping, tree stands and tree disposal bags are also sold at a Santa-friendly price. The local Girl Scouts sell fresh hand-decorated pine wreaths.

With twinkly lights overhead and holiday music playing throughout, shopping for your tree is fun and easy. Plus, the Scouts carefully place every tree on a stand, making it easy to inspect from all angles so you can make sure you're getting the perfect tree.

The tree sales are Troop 149's only fundraiser. As such, every Scout will volunteer for a minimum of 24 hours at the tree lot – rain or shine – in addition to his or her other extracurriculars, sports and academics. The Scouts of Troop 149 are residents of Mariemont, Terrace Park and Fairfax.
