

## Coronavirus Concerns at Council Meeting

Mayor Tom Tepe opened the meeting welcoming Katie Lyons as Village Clerk and Chief Fiscal Officer and thanking Christy Hampton for her past service. The Mayor urged residents to practice good hygiene and to check on elderly neighbors because of the recent virus challenges. The Mayor discussed the sewer study that may affect the Village.

He has a large binder with study facts, cost numbers and residents may see this study as Council looks for direction for TP's best interest. Please watch for kids in the streets as Spring approaches.

John Maggard: EMS Chief, reported the current EMS class is almost on board. He urged residents to wash hands, stay healthy and that the EMS is flexible and on call as we get through the current virus challenge.

Gerald Hayhow: Police Chief & Village Administrator, reminded residents to read the TP website about the virus and that Milford and Terrace Park are working on this together.

There will be sidewalk repairs and a black matte street program as warm weather arrives.

Jeff LeMay: Finance, presented three Resolutions that Council passed. The first confirmed the appointment of Katherine Lyons as Part time Village Clerk/Of-

fice Manager for the Village. The second requested the Hamilton County Auditor to Certify the Calculation of Revenue Generated by the Renewal of the Village of Terrace Park's existing 2.80 Mill Current Operating Levy. The third concerned fixing the Salaries and Ratings of Village Employees Effective March 16, 2020. Jeff said the Village spends money wisely and thanked Jerry Hayhow for his work on this.

John Gaskey: Planning & Zoning, presented an Ordinance authorizing the Village Administrator to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Hamilton County Commissioners, related to Services of the Hamilton County Building Official. Also, an Ordinance Authorizing the Village Administrator to enter an Agreement with MCWEG ADVISORY GROUP related to Professional Zoning Services.

Pax Lindell: Public Safety, presented a Resolution Authorizing and Directing the Village Administrator to enter into an Agreement with Andy Argo Construction Company LLC, for the Installation of a Storm Water Drain in the 200 Bock of Oxford and declaring an Emergency.

The meeting was adjourned.

- Working in the garden is a great opportunity to be outdoors get healthy moderate exercise.

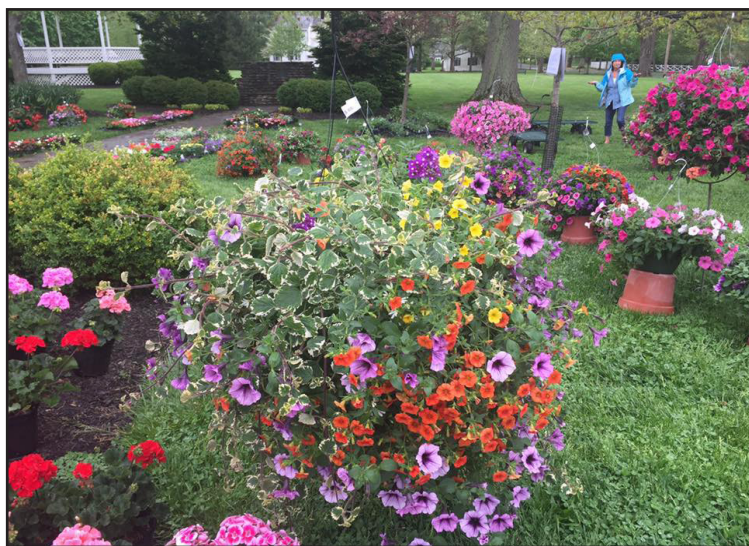
- We have gorgeous flowers that are high quality and hardy.

Terrace Park Tree Diversity G R O W S

When I started here as the Terrace Park Forester the village already had a good reputation as a Tree City and was noted as having a high species diversity. In 2010 the average small city had 3-7 species on their streets—we had over 40 species and cultivars. Over the years we have continued to add a variety of trees - many of them spring bloomers. The total number of species is expanding with our fall 2019 and spring 2020 plantings. This will put the Village in the range of a Level II arboretum with over 100 species/cultivars on our streets.

Here is the grouping of species and cultivars recently or soon

to be planted by common name: American Hornbeam, Hop Hornbeam, American Yellowwood species and cultivar, Amur Maakia, Buckeye Yellow, Catalpa Purpurea, Cherry: 3 species, 5 cultivars, Dawn Redwood, Eastern Redbud: 2 cultivars, Hardy Rubber tree, Hawthorne, Hickory Shagbark, Chinese Scholar tree, Lilac tree: 2 cultivars, Honey Locust, Purple Robe, Katsura cultivar, Kentucky Coffee tree species and cultivar, Black Gum species and cultivar, Maple Burgundy, Dogwood: 6 cultivars, Oaks- Burr-Chinquapin-Over cup- Saw tooth-Willow, Pecan, Persimmon, Sassafras, Serviceberry, Smoke tree, Sycamore, Tulip Poplar, and Zelkova.

# News From TP Historical Society

Tribute to George McIlveen  
The Terrace Park Historical Society was fortunate to have been the recipient of both the artwork and storytelling gifts of local researcher, the late George McIlveen.

George was an expert on circus history and as a way to preserve the history of the Robinson Circus of Terrace Park, he created a set of realistic models of the performers, animals, tents and parade vehicles,

which he donated to our Society and they are now on display in our museum. George was also the featured speaker for our memorable program on the Robinson Circus. McIlveen died March 6 at the age

of 86. He graduated from University of Cincinnati, was a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon and was employed by The Cincinnati Enquirer for 45 years and retired as advertising director. Services have already been held. Always an enthusiastic and ready source of information, he will be remembered fondly by all of us at the TPHS.

## Terrace Park Featured in New Book

A newly published book includes a description of life in Terrace Park during the last quarter of the 20th century. In The Women of Robertson Place: A Family Saga, former Terrace Park resident Lynn Carden writes about eight generations of her family, the last two of whom lived in Terrace Park.


From 1974 to 1998, the Carden family lived in the Victorian house at 111 Terrace Place. Lynn and her husband Doug have since moved to Robertson Place, which is Lynn's family's homestead in Ross County.

Her ancestors, having lived there since the Civil War, left behind a trove of documents, letters, tinctypes, and diaries—all of which inspired daughter, Jenny Carden, to create a 1995 documentary film and compelled Lynn to interrupt her art career in order to write the 200-year history. Carden's illustrated book reads like a novel and spotlights her maternal line from pioneer days to present day. Characters include an ambitious young couple yearning


