Coach P Looks Back on a Fantastic Season

On Saturday June 5, the Mariemont High School Boys Lacrosse team won their 5th State Title, which made history as they became the first team in Ohio DII High School Lacrosse to win five state championships. This puts Mariemont in the company of (DI) lacrosse power Upper Arlington (UA) who has long been the gold standard for Ohio boys lacrosse. Both schools now own the record for the most state titles in their respective divisions. That is pretty darn cool considering Mariemont just completed our 20th season as a varsity program this year.

Additionally UA and Mariemont are also the only two schools to have both the boys and girls win lacrosse state titles in the same season. This is something everyone is very proud of in our program.

Bringing a championship home to Mariemont was our fo-

cus all year long, and our team did it for the community and for Coach Graham Harden. We all wanted this for Graham, our families, our school and for each other. This win meant a lot, especially being the fifth since no other school had done this before in DII and no other Mariemont team has won 5 titles. We did indeed make history!

How Did We Do It?

Having a good faceoff unit, a strong defense, solid goaltending, and lots of guys that can score goals was the trademark of our team this year.. Faceoff specialists Seth Greene and Mac McLelland dominated

A Memoriable Year for Girl's Lacrosse

After the heartbreak of missing the 2020 lacrosse season, there was much uncertainty about how the 2021 season would go while still coming out of a global pandemic. Despite a year of setbacks, the Mariemont Varsity Girl's lacrosse team came out on top of the state for the second time in 3 years.

Led by seniors Marley Megowen and Sophie Toman in the midfield, Marah Campbell, Abbie Lyons, and Hailey Zobrist on attack, and Chloe Telgkamp, Claire Soller, and

Mckenzie Zobrist on defense, with Olivia Simpson in the goal, we built confidence and found our stride through the heart of the season.

In the playoffs, the Warriors enjoyed a #1 seed and a bracket in which ley Megowen led the Warriors with 5 most who could,tried to avoid running into Mariemont. We breezed through the Regionals with wins 24-0 against Maimi Valley School, 13-2 over Cin-

cinnati Country Day, 18-4 over Seven Hills School, and 16-6 over CHL rival Wyoming in the Regional Finals. The first close contest was in the State Semifinals when Mariemont held off a late charge defeating Bishop Watterson for the second time this season 14-13.

In the State Championship game, after a tightly contested 20 minutes, the Warriors' athleticism won out and they wereable to stretch out a comfortable 10-5 lead by halftime on their way to a 16-6 victory. In a strange pause during the second half, a swarm of bees invaded the Mariemont goal and after a great deal of effort led in part by the Warriors' resident beekeeper/ goalie-coach Dan George, we were able to finish the contest. Senior Margoals in the championship game, falling just one goal short of the OHSAA


We are also saying goodbye to our neighbor, Graham Harden, who passed away just a week after the lacrosse cham-

In Memory

After a 5-year battle with ALS, Graham Harden II, 52, passed away peacefully on Saturday, June 12, 2021 at his home in Terrace Park, OH.

Graham was born on July15,1968 in Newport News, VA to Holmes and Gail (Elder) Harden and grew up in New Canaan, CT. Graham attended New Canaan High School, Deerfield Academy (class of '87), UNC-Chapel Hill (class of '91), and the Kenan-Flagler Business School (class of '00). He was a multi-sport athlete at New Canaan and Deerfield and an all-American D1 lacrosse standout at UNC. In 1991, Graham co-captained the UNC men's lacrosse team to a historic 16-0 season and an NCAA championship and won the coveted Schmeisser Cup as the national defenseman of the year.

After years of athletic success as a player and a reputation as a relentless and merciless competitor, Graham found his true life calling back on the field as a highly successful youth and high school boys and girls lacrosse coach at Mariemont High School and the Royals Lacrosse Club. Graham's gift was the ability to teach his young players about integrity, compassion, sportsmanship, teamwork, and life values through sports. Through his personal struggle with ALS, his endless hours training and volunteering as a local firefighter and first responder, Graham enabled and inspired youth athletes to be more than just a good player... be a good citizen.

In August of 2016, Graham was diagnosed with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS or Lou Gehrig's disease). Graham quickly decided he was going to tackle ALS with the spirit of a competitor and, along with his legion of supporters, established a movement called GForce to build awareness and effect prognosis in developing treatments for

this currently incurable disease. His motto became "Game On, ALS".

Graham always had a passionate commitment to family, friends, neighbors, teammates, and youth. His community influence expanded outside Terrace Park to southern Ohio, Connecticut, North Carolina and beyond. He taught us all the importance of being humble and living for others.

Graham is survived by his extraordinary and mutually devoted wife, Dawn (Adler) who he met while at UNC and married in the summer of 1992. He is also survived by his daughters, Kendall and Lindsay; his son, Cole; his mother, Lucy Gail; his brothers, Boyd (and Keri) and Holmes (and Blake); his sister, Shea (and John Naporano); and numerous nieces, nephews, aunts and an uncle. Graham was preceded in death by his father, Holmes.

How do we look next year?

Although we are losing six seniors, we believe that we will be strong and will again compete for a state title. Faceoff duties will transfer to Jack Mileham, Griff Beyers and John Baumgartner to replace Seth and Mac. We return two of our three starting attackmen, our starting goalie Luke, two of our starting defenders Barrett Lindell and Mark Morgan, as well as 1st Team All Region LSM Luke Rubin, and outstanding faceoff wing and D-mid Connor Souders. Junior Sam "Chi" Ciolino and Sophomores David Dorsten and Evan Morgan also return as starting midfielders, where combined they scored 6 goals in the title game. Lots of firepower, hustle and positive energy from our players returning.

This team made history in another way too. It was our smallest roster (36 players), since our inaugural season (2002), so all of our younger players participated (and played) in 3 or more tourney games for the first time ever. This gave them experience playing in the postseason, and an extra month of practice where they all grew a lot (this year) in preparation for next

Pumpkins, gourds, cornstalks, and both large and medium sized mums will be available all from Laura who supplied the beautiful plants for our sale in May. The profits will benefit our five gardens which add to the beauty of our unique village including the original Memorial Garden to remember our departed members, the Wooster/Elm bed by the TP entry sign at the west end of the village, the Wooster/Miami bed by the entry sign at the east end of TP, and the three boxes on each side of the bridge over the bike trail. The bed at Given Road also celebrates village homes across Wooster Pike.

Members volunteer each year to plan, plant and maintain the gardens so there is always something new to catch the eye. Occasionally a bed will need a complete overhaul. On one occasion a particularly persistent, ugly grass took over a bed and another time it was wildly overgrown old taxus. Knockout Ros-



es were spectacular for several years and then collapsed. The Memorial Bed required all fresh earth, mushroom compost, and fertilizer to support the abundance of flowers that beautify it today and in the coming years. TNT Celebrates 40 Years

On a July Sunday in 1981, a group of twenty or so Terrace couples carpool to Hawk's Head State Park near Anstead West Virginia. The trip was to raft the New River with Doug and Jeff Proctor's Class VI River Runner. Avid tennis players, they brought their rackets and drew couples for the planned mixed doubles tournament. The winners received "crystal" plastic glasses with the park emblem. Arriving back home, they continued the fun with tennis at the TPSC. This evolved into the Tuesday Night Tennis or TNT which met every Tuesday evening followed by supper at the Wooden Nickel (now gone) or the Millcroft (shortly to become a distillery). In winter, tennis was abandoned for gathering outside St. Thomas to walk to the Wooden Nickel to eat together. Next, Ted Northrup organized a tournament for Jan 14th 1984 at the French Lick Resort in Indiana. A chartered bus was hired taking the 40 participants, reveling all the way, to arrive in time for Friday night supper.

Mixed doubles were played on Saturday morning and afternoon and then on Sunday morning before departure. Some energetic folks also found time for bowling. A few, with more curiosity than energy, attended the spa soaking up to the neck in hot spring water that smelled of rotten eggs (sulphur) and which left a grey, gritty ring around the tub. This was followed by a massage and a clean shower. Bliss for aching muscles! More sleeping



than reveling took place on the drive home. These trips continued through 2003. Some made a trip in 1997 to Pipestem State Park in West Virginia.

It took a world pandemic to close us down - but only briefly. When the powers that be and the weather conspired against us, we tried Zoom meetings but that didn't last. Now with the end of the harsh lockdowns and the coming of warm evenings, we are each bringing our own supper to meet at the gazebo on the green. We hope that Covid-19 will be gone before winter and we will be going back to hosting the group in our own homes.

Age, health concerns and moves to warmer climates have reduced our ranks thought some are still playing tennis. Mostly, we take turns in hosting the group for dinner in our homes with occasional restaurant dining. We have celebrated happy events and supported each other when there is loss or sadness.

In 2003 we planted an oak tree near to the swim club entrance in memory of Shirley Brown. Now a plaque hangs on the trunk memorializing TNTers Jane Pendl, Roger Belanger, Bob Grund, Fred Ğraumlich, Jackie Thompson, Ted Northrup (our "founding father"), Ann Gilchrist, Joyce Van Epps, Jack Breslin, Bob Belliveau, Stan Brown, Jim Ryan, Stan Brown, Helen Gilchrist, Tom Proctor, Joe Grano, Punkie Boylan (who built Miami Woods), MaryAnn Proctor, Jeanne Belliveau, Leland Cole, Jo Breslin, and John Crouse. Since our last effort at keeping it current, more names need to be added.

We have a photo album recording our many events, begun by Ann Gilchrist and now kept safe by Jim. Since that 1st one in July,1981, with few exceptions (Christmas, New Year's Eve, Covid, etc.) we have met every Tuesday. Our numbers are fewer but our camaraderie remains strong – this very special group called TNT.





Council Reviews Plans for New Restaurant in TP

Queen City Hospitality Group, a brand with six restaurants in Over-the-Rhine and Blue Ash, has plans for a Southern California-inspired restaurant at the former Bucks BBQ site in Terrace Park. Village Planning and Zoning officials will conduct a public hearing June 21 on a variance to revise parking space and signage restrictions for the property at 704 Wooster Pike.

If approved, owners Daniel and Lana Wright will be offering tacos, salads, ice cream, beer, wine and margaritas at their newest venture by year-end. Their other restaurants include Senate Over The Rhine, Senate Blue Ash, Pontiac, Abigail Street, Holiday Liquor Bar and Forty Thieves.

In his report at the June 8 Village Council meeting, Mayor Tom Tepe said plans for the restaurant may be viewed by the public at the village office. He further congratulated members of the Mariemont High School men and women's lacrosse teams for their history-making Division II state championships, and also congratulated Terrace Park's recent high school graduates and the sixth-grade winner of the annual Memorial Day essay competition, Elle Seichter. The mayor expressed gratitude to Mark Holcomb, Jack Smith and Ray Normile for conducting the community's Memorial Day observance on the Village Green.

In Council action:

• The first reading of the 2022 annual tax budget was approved. The \$2.05-million proposal closely resembles the \$2.06-million 2021 budget and will be offered to the public for comment June 29 at 7:15 p.m.

• A resolution that places the remaining \$5,273 COVID relief funds in the 2021 appropriations budget was approved.

• An ordinance giving the Ohio Department of Transportation authority to maintain, repair and remove ice and snow from the Terrace Park corridor of Wooster Pike was approved. Resurfacing bids will be invited in 2022 for work in 2023.

In other village news:

- An outdoor water fountain is being installed at the Log Cabin with CARES Act funds.
- Labor Day festivities will resume after a COVID-year hiatus. The new tower clock on the Village Green will be dedicated during the program.
- Street resurfacing and sidewalk repairs have been completed for 2021.
- The Finance Committee will meet with Frost Brown Todd Attorneys June 14 regarding the firm's retainer for interpretation of Ohio's septic system law that goes into effect in 2025 and affects about 600 Terrace Park homeowners. (Background information has been provided in previous editions of Village Views and is available on the village website www.terracepark.org.)




