More Thanks and Kudos For Healthcare Heroes

A Valentine's Day campaign to thank local health care heroes for their Covid-19 service, led Mayor Tom Tepe to declare March 22 "Health Care Worker Appreciation Day" in Terrace Park.

It all began when Joan Tollefsen invited residents to submit letters of appreciation and sweet treats for distribution among nearly 40 health care workers in advance of Covid's two-year milestone. By the time council member Regina Sharp read the mayor's proclamation at village council's March 1 meeting, the list of health care heroes praised for their selfless commitment and courage exceeded 70.

Also receiving plaudits at the monthly meeting were the four newest members of Terrace Park Volunteer Emergency Medical Services: Jessica Pembleton, Jenn Arnovitz, Kyle Welling and Creigh Long. Lauren Ingebritson, council member for public safety, praised them for their "invaluable service to our community ... the highest form of volunteerism we have," and Mayor Tepe swore them into service.

Former Terrace Park auxiliary police officer Joe Murray attended the meeting to introduce himself as a candidate for Ohio 27th District House of Representatives in the May 3 election. Murray is a graduate of Turpin High School and has a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. He wants to succeed Tom Brinkman, who is not seeking re-election due to term limitations.

An ordinance and two resolutions were approved and as a result:

form openness for fences facing a front yard and guidelines for parking trailers in a side yard;

 Administrator Jerry Hayhow may distribute a three percent increase in the wages and salaries budget among employees, with raises awarded at his discretion; and

• The police department will replace an aging cruiser with a 2022 Ford Explorer at a cost of
