Clean-Up Time At Village Environmental Center

A major cleanup is in the works at the Terrace Park Environmental Center, where residents are permitted to store vehicles, trailers, boats, campers and other large items that would create neighborhood eyesores and/or violate village zoning regulations.

When identification can be established, owners of abandoned or deteriorating items will be contacted about removal of their property from the site, which is commonly known as the village landfill. If necessary, the fire department may be called upon for assistance.

"We want to make it a better utilized space for residents," said Mayor Tom Tepe at Village Council's May 10 meeting. "We want to get people to clean-up what they may have forgotten for decades."

Other items of note from the monthly meeting:

- The 2023 appropriations budget, which is two percent higher than the 2022 budget, received first-reading approval. A public hearing will be scheduled prior to the second and final reading.
- The community building is getting a new roof and gutters at a cost of about \$55,000. Funds from the American Rescue Plan Act will be used for the work, which will be done by Harper Siding & Roofing.

• Rainwater runoff and

drainage issues in the Red Bird Lane cul-de-sac are being addressed. A catch basic with a pipe to a nearby creek may be a solution but other remedies will also be explored to restore the street's attractive appearance and functionality.

• Council observed a moment of silence in honor of the late Jack Brown, who served on village council for eight years.

• Residents are encouraged to visit the village website at www.terracepark.org and sign-up for CodeRed, a free notification service that enables officials to issue advisories about local emergencies, road closures and other business.
