

Miami Grove Gazebo To Honor Memory Of Kristin Crowley

Kristin Crowley enjoyed Miami Grove's natural beauty with family, friends and her yellow lab, Zami. And now in her memory, a gazebo will be constructed at the nature preserve.

After hearing from her husband Shawn, whose donation will finance the project, Terrace Park Village Council voted March 19 to permit the Ohio River Foundation to oversee construction of the shelter. The village will maintain the structure in perpetuity.

Council also approved a three percent payroll increase, which Administrator Jerry Hayhow will award at his discretion among village employees, and a resolution asking the Hamilton County auditor to certify an additional 2.45 mill tax increase for residents to consider on the Nov. 4 ballot.

Though there is no state law requiring municipalities to have six months of operating funds in reserve, it is a recommended best practice. The finance committee's revenue and spending forecast shows the village is fiscally sound but will drop below the threshold in late 2025 or 2026. Councilmember Jeff LeMay said it has been 12 years since the village has placed a tax increase on the ballot.

Approval also was given the appointment of two emergency medical services technicians. Mayor Tom Tepe then administered the oath of service to Christine Kullgren, who is a dispatch call-taker for the city of Cincinnati, and Rashawn Manigan, a paramedic who works full-time in the Dayton area.

Administrator Hayhow said Duke Energy's contractor, RLA Utilities, has begun phase one of the replacement of aging steel pipelines with plastic pipes. The project is expected to take three

years and affect 95 percent of local homes, starting with Harvard Avenue residences. Updates and advisories will be available on the village website www.terracepark.org and sent through the CodeRED system, a free online service that provides registered residents with timely announcements and updates on official business. Sign-up instructions are available on the website or by texting "terracepark" to 99411 with a smartphone.

In a recent advisory, residents were asked to keep in mind that "items such as invisible fences and irrigation systems that were installed on the village right of way are susceptible to damage. The contractor is not responsible for damage to installation on the village/utility right of way. Questions, please contact Duke at 513-287-2130. If you have any questions about the village right of way on your street please call the village office."

Hayhow added that Katie Lyons, village clerk, has created a quick guide to help answer right of way questions. He suggested that residents who are planning improvements such as driveway repair in the right of way may want to factor the pipeline project into their timeline.

On other topics, Hayhow said:

- He has researched asphalt rejuvenation products and identified one with pliable properties that discourage cracking. It will be applied to Princeton, Poplar, Franklin, Douglas and portions of Stanton Avenue.

- Final plans for the Elm Avenue water line extension are scheduled for approval by the Ohio EPA in May; bidding will begin in June; a contract will be awarded in August; and construction

tion will take place in March and April 2026.
• Two new median light posts will be installed on Wooster Pike when weather conditions are favorable. Insurance payments from the parties responsible for damage to the previous posts will defray costs.
In their monthly reports:
• Mayor Tepe reminded motorists to watch out for children now that days are warmer and more children are playing outdoors.
• EMS Chief John Mag-

gard said the new EMS class is enthusiastic and doing very well. Department volunteers have taken additional training in dementia trauma and joint training with local fire department volunteers.
• Fire Chief George Hefner submitted a written report. Among highlights: A mobile data computer, which is actually a small tablet with its own server and modem, has been installed in the alarm room. It complements the units in the village’s emergency vehicles and will enhance dispatch coordination. In addition, volunteers have participated in a wide range of training exercises.

The Bach Ensemble Chorale will present a concert of sacred choral masterpieces spanning four centuries on Sunday, April 6, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. at St. Thomas Episcopal Church.

The program features works from the Renaissance to the 20th century, showcasing the ensemble's versatility and technical precision. Opening with William Byrd's jubilant "Sing Joyfully," the concert continues with Byrd's contemplative "Mass for Four Voices," one of the finest examples of Renaissance polyphony.

The second half begins with J.S. Bach's motet "Fürchte dich nicht" (Fear Not), BWV 228, a work of profound spiritual depth. Johannes Brahms' "Schaffe

in mir, Gott, ein rein Herz" (Create in me a clean heart, O God) follows, demonstrating the composer's masterful command of harmony. The program concludes with Benjamin Britten's "Hymn to St. Cecilia," his settings of W.H. Auden's poetry celebrating the patron saint of music.

"These composers have always had a special meaning to me, and it is a thrill to perform these works with the incredible musicians of the Bach Ensemble," says Carlton Monroe, Artistic Director of the Bach Ensemble Chorale. "This program hearkens back to a conducting recital I gave almost 25 years ago."

The concert will be held at St. Thomas Episcopal Church, 100 Miami Avenue, Terrace Park,

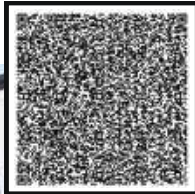
