Mayor's report:

Mayor Jay Gohman thanked all of the Terrace Park residents, especially Emily Parker, who have worked so hard opposing the mining opposition and also Hester Sullivan and Bill Hayes for chairing the "Caboomapalooza" blasting fundraiser in Terrace Park on October 23rd.

Displaying signs and construction projects:

With the up-coming election, the mayor reminded residents to follow the Village signage rules (section 1137 zoning code) as listed on the Village web site. A reminder was also given that all construction projects be presented to the Village office for approval prior to starting to avoid delays and added expenses. Bill

Fiedler, building official, noted that he would be meeting with businesses along Wooster Pike to advise them of the new signage rules.

Chief fiscal officer and Martin/Marietta progress:

Chief Fiscal Officer Mark Holcomb requested that residents promptly cash any checks in order to keep the financial reports up-to-date. He presented an up-date on the Martin/Marietta briefs. Filings for dismissal have been made with motions to vacate the zoning board's decision on the basis that the board does not have jurisdiction over these specific zoning items. Rulings will be made in November with oral arguments set for December 21st.

Life Squad, Fire chief and Police

chief up-dates:

EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) training this month included units on Pediatric emergencies and airway skills. Only four residents have indicated an interest in taking the EMT training this fall. More are needed. New cot and stair-chairs have been put into service making patient transport much safer. Councilman Jim Muennich thanked the EMS, Fire Department, and Police Department for their professional and prompt response to his recent home emergency.

Dear Terrace Park Neighbor

October 5, 2010

Village Council asks all Terrace Park voters to approve an "additional" tax levy of 2.8 mills this November 2nd. While this is technically an additional levy, it is designed to replace revenue the village lost in 2010 when we mistakenly allowed expiration of our 3.5 mill operating levy. Voting "FOR" this levy will restore the Terrace Park portion of your real estate taxes to their 2009 levels. This levy will appear on the ballot as issue 29:

29 PROPOSED TAX LEVY (ADDITIONAL) VILLAGE OF TERRACE PARK

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

An additional tax for the benefit of the Village of Terrace Park, County of Hamilton, Ohio, for the purpose of CURRENT OPERATING EXPENSES at a rate not exceeding two and eight-tenths (2.8) mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to twenty-eight cents (\$0.28) for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for five (5) years, commencing in 2010, first due in calendar year 2011.

FOR THE TAX LEVY
AGAINST THE TAX LEVY

The ballot states the actual millage (\$0.28) per \$100 of assessed valuation which is different than market value and can be confusing. Typically newspapers and other sources express levies in annual cost per \$100K of market value. This levy will carry an approximate annual cost of \$83.43 per \$100,000 of Auditor assigned Market Value.

Our goal is to maintain the high quality services you have come to expect from Terrace Park. This operating levy is a significant source of village funds, accounting for about 15% of our annual receipts. We constantly look for ways to save money and are committed to operating as efficiently as possible. Please help us maintain Terrace Park services by voting "FOR THE TAX LEVY" to add a 2.8 mill operating levy on November 2nd.

Local high school seniors recognized by National Merit Scholarship Corp.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) has announced the names of approximately 16,000 semi-finalists in the 56th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. Several Terrace Park high school seniors were among this prestigious group. Conor Cohan, William Degerberg, Andrew Gorman, Erin Purcell, and Hillary Purcell from Mariemont High School (5 students total) and Baldur Tangvald from Cincinnati Country Day School (10 students total).



Baldur Tangvald was named a 2010 National Merit Semi-Finalist from Cincinnati Country Day School.

Mariemont Schools also announced their students receiving letters of commendation: David Finn, Stacy Purcell, Tim Purcell and Emily Taylor. Their scores placed them in the top five percent of all juniors who took the national exam last year.

The semi-finalist students now compete for finalist status by showing

they have an outstanding academic record, have SAT scores that confirm their earlier qualifying test performance (based on PSAT scores from October, 2009), and have their school's endorsement. About 90 per-

cent of the semi-finalists advance to Finalist status, at which time they will compete for one of the National Merit scholarships, corporate-sponsored scholarships, or college-sponsored scholarships.



of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of the exams.

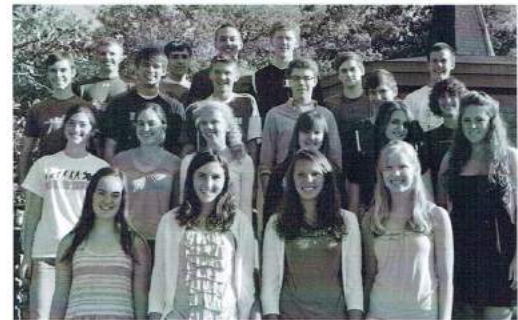

Police report

Terrace Park police responded to six mutual aid requests (Milford and Newtown) and two Life Squad runs.

Locally there was a registered complaint of unauthorized use of a business's dumpster at 415 Terrace Place. There were several barking dog complaints (Denison and Wanoka Woods) and a report of one dog bite. The police assisted with three vehicle lock-outs and two residence lock-outs. Broken glass and other damage was reported at the site of the Labor Day Garage sale. Theft of a septic tank motor was reported by a resident on Indian Hill Road.

A Terrace Park resident reported seeing a suspicious person in a "beat-

en-up gray van" regularly over the past two weeks in the Terrace Park Swim Club parking lot. The driver was a man with white hair and a long beard, who, when approached, drove away.

Arrests/citations: two apprehensions were made during traffic stops for drivers with open warrants. An intoxicated driver was also taken into custody and cited. A case of road rage was reported on Wooster Pike: A driver reported a pick-up truck tailgating him, pulling into the center lane to pass him, and then immediately slamming on his brakes nearly causing an accident. Police noted the license plate and stated they would watch for the vehicle in case of further incident.
