



Former Resident To Appear on Jeopardy!

A former Terrace Park resident and MHS Alum Ryan Wenstrup-Moore will appear as a contestant on an upcoming episode of the Emmy award winning game show Jeopardy! with host Alex Trebek. Ryan had an in person interview with producers in September 2018 and was afterward selected to appear as a contestant on the show. She flew to L.A. just before Thanksgiving 2019 to tape the episode.

Ryan is the Associate Director of Social Media at gyro and lives with her family in Hyde Park. She grew up on Wrenwood Lane and graduated with the Mariemont High School class of 1998 before graduating from The University of Cincinnati and later earning her

masters degree from the University of Strathclyde in Scotland. Ryan was also a contributor to the Village Views during her high school years and covered news at MHS for the paper. She is the sister of Terrace Park resident and contributing Views photographer, Alison Fopano, so in a way, she is where she is today because of The Village Views. Or at least that is what we tell ourselves.

The game show, created by Merv Griffin in 1964 is formatted as quiz competition where three contestants are presented with clues in form of answers and must phrase their response in the form of a question. Ryan's episode will air Wednesday, January 29 on Fox19.

Mayor Tepe Sworn In For 2nd term

The January 2020 meeting of the Village of Terrace Park Council was called to order by Mayor Tepe. He began by congratulating council members Pax Lindell and John Gaskey on their recent re-election to council and official swearing ins on January 1, along with Mayor Tepe.

Mayor: Mr. Tepe noted there are a few changes to the council committee chairs: Buildings & Grounds is now chaired by Regina Sharp. Planning & Zoning is now chaired by John Gaskey. Public Safety is now chaired by Lauren Ingebritson.

Police Chief/Village Administrator: Chief Hayhow indicated he is working with Hylant for our liability coverage and the storm water management team from Hamilton County regarding our maintenance area storm water plan and permit compliance. He will soon be identifying the project areas for sidewalk and street repairs in the village. He also noted we had 92 truckloads of leaves picked up this fall, which is slightly down from previous years (due to trees that have been cut down).

EMS Chief: John Maggard reported 9 EMS dispatches since the first of the year. The current EMS re-

cruit class has 3 members - thanks to them for their commitment!

Finance: Jeff LeMay presented Resolution 1-1, 2020 authorizing continuing insurance coverage for the Village of Terrace Park under the Ohio government risk management plan and authorizing payment. The amount is less than previous years because of continued risk management programs the village has put in place. The resolution passed. He then reviewed the annual financial report, which shows the village is fiscally sound. If we continue at this spending & revenue stream, we could probably go another 6-8 years without putting a levy on the ballot.

Public Works: Pax Lindell presented Resolution 1-2, 2020 adopting amended article I, III and V rules and regulations for the Hamilton County storm water district (HCSWD). This is a continuation of Terrace Park being a part of the HCSWD, and so we get amendments as HCSWD approves them. The resolution passed.

Public Safety: Lauren Ingebritson presented Resolution 1-3, 2020 authorizing and directing the village administrator to enter into an emergency medical services

contract with the Miami Township board of trustees for paramedic services and declaring an emergency. This is a continuation of a longstanding contract, and the resolution passed. She then presented Resolution 1-4, 2020 appointing Lauren Ingebritson and Jeff LeMay to the volunteer firefighters' dependants fund board. The council members take turns serving on this board, and we hope it's something that we never need in Terrace Park. The resolution passed.

The Mayor gave a brief sewer update to Council. He has heard that the MSD director has received the report from the consultant but has not read it yet. Mayor Tepe will continue to ask MSD for updates and will advise when he does.

With no new business, the Mayor adjourned the meeting.



Len Goorian Dead at 100

Former Terrace Park resident and Cincinnati television pioneer Len Goorian died on January 20th at the age of 100. He was born in Brooklyn in 1920 and as an Arthur Murray trained dancer he entertained troops during the War, danced on luxury ocean liners, and eventually parlayed his onstage presence into a career in the pioneer days of television in Cincinnati. Goorian worked with all of the great names from the early days of broadcasting including Ruth Lyons, Paul Dixon, Bob Schreve and Dottie Mack. He was perhaps the last of this generation of Cincinnatians who ushered in the new medium of television. He hosted his own show on WKRC in the late 1960s, interviewing celebrities and politicians

from around the country. Senator Robert F. Kennedy was a guest on Goorian's show shortly before he was assassinated in 1968. "Goorian was one of those TV pioneers who helped make up TV as they went along, and he was still on the air into a new century," said John Kiesewetter, longtime local TV-radio critic and historian, first for The Enquirer and now for WVXU. In 1959, Len and his wife Myrri purchased 907 Elm Avenue and raised their daughters there, making Terrace Park their home for the next twenty five years. Myrri passed away in 2009. Len Goorian was an extraordinary individual, having witnessed a century of history first hand with a mind sharp enough to recall it all until the end.


