# Council Reviews Miami Grove Nature Preserve Regulations

Mayor Report: Mr. Tepe reminded residents to continue with safe practices and to follow the state recommendations and guidelines. With the Village receiving a lot of rain recently, he reminded everyone that there is only so much the Village can do but will continue to clean out areas where water collects. Please notify the Village of any high water. Mayor Tepe gave thanks to Chief Hayhow and his crew for making everything look great in the Village and for all of the brush and vegetation collections.

EMS: A welcome was given by Mr. Maggard to Jordan Lococo as a member of the volunteer EMS staff for the summer months. A thanks was also given to Cincinnati State for assisting the three current trainees to complete their training class.

Police Chief/Village Administrator: Chief Hayhow reported that there was no property damage to residents due to the recent flooding even though water was higher than has been seen in prior years. The annual asphalt repair and mat

seal program will begin in three weeks, weather permitting. Due to some budget limitations, only major resurfacing/sealing will be completed The Mayor noted that if additional funds come through, then more will streets/sidewalk will be done. Mr. LeMay, Finance, stated that a projected reduction in revenues to the Village would be approximately \$20-25,000 thus the Village is being conservative on street/sidewalk repairs until the funding is definite.

Building/Grounds: committee is working with the Clerk of the Council in reviewing the Village's Rules/Laws regarding the Wildness Preserve regulations since these have not been updated since 1996. With more heavy usage of this area, the Mayor requested this review to improve and possibly tighten up some of the regulations.

Finance: Thanks was given to the Clerk of the Council and the Village Administrator for their work on 2021 Village's budget that

What would you do if you walked through the aftermath of an atomic bomb in 1945? What would you do if you lost 114 pounds from being a prisoner of war in Japan? This is one of many stories that make Memorial Day an important holiday in our country to honor. Memorial Day is a day we all come together to honor and celebrate the men and women that died while serving our country. We honor the people that have put their lives on the line to save ours. America celebrates the five branches of the military- the Army,, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, and the Coast Guard.

Memorial Day became an official holiday in 1971. For most of us, it marks the beginning of the summer season. One of the earliest Memorial Day ceremonies was held by freed slaves. The Civil War claimed so many lives it required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries. General John A. Logan called for a national

Day of Remembrance later that month. People commemorate Memorial Day by placing flowers to remember the fallen and by reciting prayers.

One of these many stories is my great great uncle Edwin Erdman. He was born in 1921. In 1941, he enlisted in the United States Navy to fight in World War Two and immediately sailed to the Philippines. In 1941, he was captured by the Japanese. He was in the Bataan Death March and walked 80 miles

## he Buzz About Buz

Ever since the days of John Robinson riding a chariot pulled by one of his circus zebras, Terrace Park has been home to some of the best and most interesting people you'll ever meet. Recently I read something on Facebook from Rosie Ecker about one of these people- her father, Buz. Rosie grew up on Myrtle in the house where her parents Buz and Betsy still live.

Now, if you don't know Buz Ecker, you are missing out. He's an English Professor at UC, drives a bus around the country in June picking up summer campers and taking them to Michigan, and legend has it he can turn a mighty oak into three cords of firewood in just under two hours.

But these qualities pale in comparison to what Rosie was posting about him on Facebook. Buz, as it turns out, is a prolific letter writer And I don't just mean that he drops a card in the mail for his kids on their birthdays. I think Rosie put it best in her submission to to the podcast Humans Of New

"My dad is a character. Literally. His actual name is James. But everyone calls him Buz—with only one 'z.' He loves being the center of attention. When I was a kid, whenever we took family photos, he'd lift up his shirt to show off his hairy stomach. And he still calls my grandmother every April Fool's day to tell her my mom is pregnant. Not everyone thinks he's funny. I used to be terrified that he'd start talking to other parents at school dances. Because he doesn't really converse. He just launches into stories. And they're not always appropriate. The letter writing started in fourth grade. I went to a sleep away camp thirty minutes from my house, and he wrote me letters every day. Then he did it again in fifth grade. And sixth. And seventh. My trips to camp grew longer until I was working as a counselor and staying all summer. And he still wrote me a letter-- every single day. The letters continued into college. And I still get them today. I've gotten almost 500 of them since I moved into this apartment—even though my dad lives 20 minutes down the street. Most of the letters just talk about his day. But they can also be very creative and hilarious. He once wrote 250 words about his Subway sandwich. I don't think he can stop at this point. It's part of his character. I wrote an article about him in my college paper, and he just loved being 'the guy who writes his daughter letters.' But I also view the letters as insane devotions of his love. He cries every time he takes me to the airport. He brings me flowers whenever I'm sad. With all his quirks, I really lucked out with this guy. I was once talking with my friend, and I asked her if she

thought my dad was... you know... a little... 'different.' And I've always remembered her response. She said: 'If he is, would you even care?

Rosie also posted some good liners she found while recently sifting through the old letters:

"...I'm serious. I don't know how much more technology I can soak into my brain...I'm so lucky to have you as my daughter...I'm not a gossip, which is the worst word possible you could use to describe me...I'm very disappointed that you got a speeding ticket...I don't know, I just really like it when the dogs chase after each other on the hardwood floors in the kitchen, can't stop, then crash into the wall or furniture."

When COVID-19 hit, Buz decided to take it to a whole new level and began writing to patients he's never met who live in area nursing homes and are unable to have visitors. In a recent interview with WVXU, Buz said, "The letters are filled with incidents that I have- finding a lost dog or getting Continued Pg.2 - Buz

across the Bataan Peninsula. My great great uncle was a prisoner of war for four years; he weighed 200 pounds before war and 86 pounds when he walked to his freedom. My great great uncle had lost 114 pounds while being a POW. He was in three different camps over four years. He was a prisoner until 1945 when Japan surrendered. He woke up one day to find no prison guards. The US Air Corps dropped leaflets to let everyone know that the war was over. The prisoners of war got back to America by following the rivers to the ocean. My great great uncle walked through what was left of Hiroshima after the US dropped the atomic bomb. He was then taken back to America by a Naval ship. My great great uncle had survived

into an argument with my wife... or some funny incident with a child or growing up, or teaching at UC." His letters are so popular among area nursing homes that at Beechwood Home in Hyde Park the staff reads them over the intercom for all to enjoy. "I say 'Hello, Buz Ecker here," he said, and then goes on to write just as though they were old friends. These small acts of kindness continue help the most lonely and vulnerable during this pan-

the war. He was 24 when it ended. He then had to be in a hospital for one year. He had a very bad heart from being malnourished. My great great uncle stayed in the Navy Reserves for many years after the war. He died here in Cincinnati at the age 64. For many people who met Eddie, he was known for his bravery. For my family, we remember him as a kind and loving person. I will always appreciate what he and others did for our country.

In conclusion, In 1945 when WW2 ended many soldiers did not come home.

It is important to America that we honor the sacrifices that many men and women have made. Their selflessness and courage are important to remember. They gave up their lives so that we could live ours freely and peacefully.

### 100 Years of Greatness

Ace Tollefsen would not want any fuss about his upcoming birthday on May 22. He is a modest man, one with quiet class - an old-school gentleman who would rather have others in the spotlight. However, he has touched so many lives, we wanted to tell his story in celebration of his 100 trips around the sun.

My father-in-law is the epitome of the Greatest Generation. He was born in Chicago to Norwegian immigrants, the 6th of 8 kids, growing up during the Great Depression. He enlisted at 21 years of age in the Marines the day after Pearl Harbor and served in the South Pacific. After the war, he joined one of the first classes of the then-new Roosevelt University in Chicago and later moved to Cincinnati for a job. There he met his future wife, Helen, and they married and had two boys - Scott and Blake. They moved to Terrace Park in 1958 and lived on Floral Avenue for over 60 years where he was actively involved in the village. He laid the groundwork for the strong Scout program we have today and has been a pillar of St. Thomas Church - serving and volunteering whenever a job needed to be done until his waning eyesight got in the

After retiring from a career in sales, Ace became a Patient Representative at Bethesda North Hospital, visiting patients and advocating for them for 17 years. Ace quietly leads a good life in other ways. He took an elderly gentleman to lunch every week for many years to help




