Village Operations Thank You List Surpasses 100

It takes a village of dedicated people to keep Terrace Park operating smoothly, and at Village Council's Dec. 14 meeting Mayor Tom Tepe thanked each of the 110 paid and unpaid individuals with a reading of their names.

He does that annually to enter their names into the official record, bring attention to the many volunteers required to conduct village business, and publicly recognize both those whom residents see and the majority who work in obscurity. It's also an opportunity for him to encourage more volunteerism. Police Chief and Village Administrator Jerry Hayhow received special recognition for his leadership from the mayor and council members. The names of those recognized can be accessed online at www.terracepark.org.

In council business, a resolution was passed to transfer 2021 allocations from one account to another. Finance chair Jeff LeMay noted that this year's budget was prepared 18 months ago and this is only its third minor adjustment. A proposal for two new benches on the Village Green was presented by Terrace Park Garden Club members Ogle Annett, Lucy Maish and Lois Knox. Steve Smith, longtime local resident and owner of Smith's Camargo Landscape, distributed design and installation information. The new benches would complement two other benches also

donated by the club and will commemorate the organization's 100th anniversary. Council members expressed gratitude for the club's generosity and Mayor Tepe provided guidelines for the public grounds approval process.

In other action:

Mayor Tepe congratulated recently re-elected council members and said he would swear them into office sometime prior to the next Village Council meeting Jan. 11. The four are: Lauren Ingebritson, Judith Lehman, Jeff LeMay and Regina Sharp. John Gaskey, councilman who oversees Planning and Zoning, thanked committee chair-David Moyer for his leadership and presented the committee's recommendation for zoning code edits pertaining to fences in a rear yard on a corner lot, uniform openness for fences facing a front yard and guidelines for parking trailers in a rear yard. A public hearing on the changes will be scheduled.

Of note: Councilman LeMay hopes to bring updates from sewer negotiations with Hamilton County officials to the January council meeting. EMS Chief John Maggard and Fire Chief Steve Dronsfield confirmed the annual Pancake

Supper fundraiser, cancelled last year due to Covid, has been cancelled again this year. As a safety precaution, Chief Dronsfield asks residents to make sure their chimneys are clean and in good working order before using their fireplaces.

Ruthven Mural Beautifies Area

If you've made the drive to Milford in the last few months you have surely seen the beautiful mural that now graces the bike trail retaining wall. It features the work of internationally renowned wildlife artist and area resident, John A. Ruthven who passed away in October 2020. Mr. Ruthven was the modern day John James Audubon, and his incredibly detailed depictions of flora and fauna can be found in The Smithsonian, The White House, and even on a United States Postage Stamp.

Ruthven was trained at the Cincinnati Art Academy, served in the Second World War, and was a prolific painter for decades at his beautiful Georgetown Farm and later his residence in Mariemont. Perhaps the pinnacle of his career came when he became a recipient of the 2004 National Medal of Arts, presented to him by President George W. Bush. Mr. Ruthven was a renaissance man, a wonderful story teller and an incredibly interesting person.

ArtWorks partnered with the Judy & John Ruthven Foundation to employ ten local youth apprentices to work under the direction and mentorship of four teaching artists to create the 2,500 square foot mural during the summer and fall of 2021. Terrace Park's connection to the mural is even stronger as Ruthven's grandsons, Adam and Matt Weissman are MHS graduates and both live in Terrace Park with their families today.






