

Holiday Home Decorating Contest Lights up TP

There was a new contestant and champion this year who took home the Clark W. Griswold award...it's the Batemans at 822 Myrtle! Honorable mentions this year include the Tritschs at 1 Lexington Circle, the Detwillers at 108 Wrenwood, and of course the Hesser's tree at 801 Miami- the grand dame of Miami Avenue! Along with a special gift for the winner's Christmas trees, a \$100 donation was made to a charity of their choice. The Satterwhites have chosen the Joe Burrow Foundation. Fond Farewell Given History-Making Officer

The longest-serving police officer in Terrace Park history was honored at Village Council's Dec. 13 meeting with a retirement send-off. Village officials and family members offered officer Doug Sowders plaudits and gratitude for his 31 years of service, which began in 1991 as an auxiliary patrolman and became a fulltime job in 1996.

Village Administrator and Police Chief Jerry Hayhow said it was an honor to serve with Officer Sowders and Mayor Tom Tepe referenced commendations he'd received over the years from residents, police chiefs and neighboring communities.

"It wasn't easy to see him go to work at night and hope everything was going to be all right," said his daughter Sabrina Sowders. "But at the heart of everything he does is caring for people; he genuinely cares about people."

Turning to her father, she told him she's proud of him, grateful to see him receive the recognition and love he deserves, and thanked him for being a role model for their family and a public servant for the people of Terrace Park.

Officer Sowders thanked his wife and family for their support and said he thanks God for being able to work in Terrace Park. "I couldn't have asked for a better place to have a career," he said.

In council business, Mag-

gie Quinlan's status was change from part-time to full-time police officer and Jacob Stoll was appointed a full-time officer; the 2022 village budget was amended to redistribute funds among cost and revenue centers; the 2023 budget was certified for Hamilton County review; and Lauren Ingebritson and Jeff LeMay were reappointed to one-year terms on the Volunteer Firefighters' Dependents Fund Board.

In their monthly report • Mayor Tepe thanked elected officials, employees and volunteers for their service to Terrace Park's 2,200 residents and read each name so it is entered into the official record for posterity. He encouraged residents to contact the village

administrator, EMS chief or fire chief for ways they, too, can serve and thereby keep the cost of village operations as low as possible. "We could not do what we do with the revenue we have without volunteer help," he said.

• EMS Chief John Maggard said training for emergency medical services recruits will begin in January and four new firefighters are completing their training.
